

BOUNCE BACK FENCE Planning and Preparation

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- Use stakes and string lines to mark out proposed area.
- Ensure grass, debris and other vegetation will not interfere with staked and stringed area.
- \bigcirc Look at the topography of the area and flatten fence line as much as possible.
- \bigcirc Mark out gates and ensure they meet the needs of both you and the animal(s).
- Work out how many straining posts are required
- > How many intermediate posts are required?
- How many Bounce Back Fence rails will be required? (typically 2-4)
- Calculate how many Bounce Back Vices, Joiners and Brackets are required.
- Have access to auger, shovels and other equipment.
- Be willing to ensure that all posts are sufficient for bracing. Ground conditions must be considered for depth and materials. Not all installations will be standard.
- Think safety first. Use gloves and eye wear. If using large machinery, please be aware of overhead power lines (if applicable to your area).
